She is a past president of the California School Nurses Organization (CSNO). She served as president of the National Association of State School Nurse Consultants from 2006 to 2007. Linda is a Fellow of NASN and a Fellow of the American School Health Association. Linda has presented nationally on food allergy management, coordinated school health, and school medication administration policy. She was the principal author of the CDE's guidance documents on medication administration, epinephrine auto-injector administration standards, scoliosis screening, and vision testing.
