Creativity sparks at HT Conference (27-28 June 2014)

Pi lota Chapter co-organised the 1st International Conference on Horticultural Therapy and Therapeutic Landscaping from 27 to 28 June at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. The conference was a response to the increasing popularity of integrating horticultural therapy (HT) and therapeutic landscaping to address the multi-faceted health needs of society. It provided a valuable platform for idea and experience exchange in an emerging area of healthcare. Treatments and rehabilitation approaches of horticulture application for health and well-being were explored in the conference. Topics discussed ranged from improving psychophysical health with strengthen functional hand grip effects, measuring the impact of HT on clients with cognitive impairment, chemical dependence, terminal illness, to promoting successful aging and social integration of youth and elderly through HT activities.

Projects planned and implemented by nursing professionals, horticultural therapists, school educators, social workers and other disciplines were showcased during the

conference period. These collaborative efforts have shown that creative leaders are capable of transforming old ideas to new innovations (for example, HT is re-defined as an activity to enhance social, emotional and physical well-being, rather than a recreational pastime).

Collaboration with Upsilon Eta Singapore (15-17 August 2014)

A good idea or good work would never come to fruition if the practitioner leader had not been tenacious. With great intention and support from the chapter leaders and members, we have overcome the budget obstacle and moved forward to collaborate with Upsilon Eta Chapter to jointly organise the Regional Conference on Integrated Care & 1st Singapore-Hong Kong Congress on Innovation in Nursing Practice. Over 200 registrars attended a full day programme on 17 August to examine the development of nursing leadership and practice. Gratitude to a number of PIC members and other Hong Kong delegates presented their studies in this conference.

In line with the strategic directions of STTI, let's encourage and empower our PIC members to continue to strive for excellence by serving locally, transforming regionally, and leading globally! Above all, I hope you will accept my invitation to renew your lapsed membership and join the band wagon to celebrate our upcoming 15th Anniversary of Pi lota Chapter in March 2015!

The 25th International Nursing Research Congress was held on 24-28 July in Hong Kong. Our Chapter fully supported and contributed to the congress. The Chapter obtained the professional development fund from the Association of Hong Kong Nursing Staff to sponsor the plenary session of the congress, which was spoken by the STTI President Hester Klopper. The title of the speech was "Engaging Colleagues: Improving Global Health Outcome".

Solidarity among the Asia chapters was strengthened through this collaborative Asia scholars symposium. Professor Sophia Chan Siu-chee, under Secretary for Food and Health, Food and Health Bureau was Guest of Honour to officiate the opening of the INRC.

On 28 July 2014, a post-congress event including two separate facility tours to the School of Nursing, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University and Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital, were host by the PIC Board members. Around 50 congress attendees from all over the world joined the tour to learn more about nursing and health care facilities in Hong Kong. About 25 participants visited the Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital, which has the largest scale of services among all the private hospitals in Hong Kong. The visiting sites included the Private Patient Clinic, the Private Ward for semi-private single room and private room, along with the Intensive Care Unit, the Department of Physiotherapy, and the Comprehensive Oncology Centre in particular the services provided by the Breast Care Centre.



Twenty-two participants visited the School of Nursing, PolyU. Prior to the visiting of PolyU's nursing laboratories and Integrative Health Clinic, congress attendees met PIC's former and current board members including Prof Alice Yuen Loke, Dr E.Angela Chan, Dr Alice Wong, and Dr Maria Hung and exchanged ideas on research and nursing curriculum in Hong Kong.
